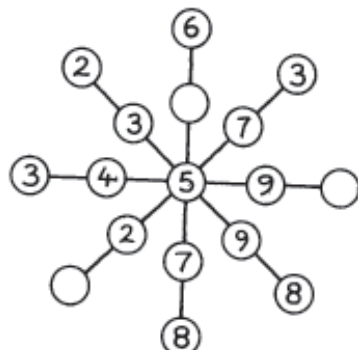

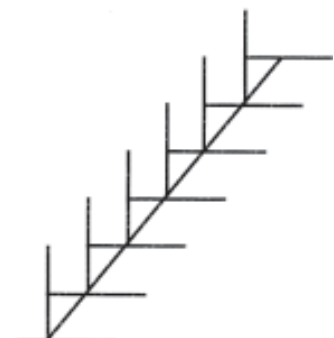

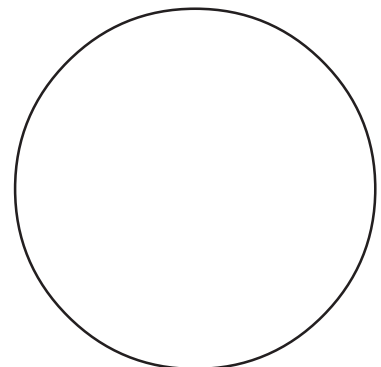

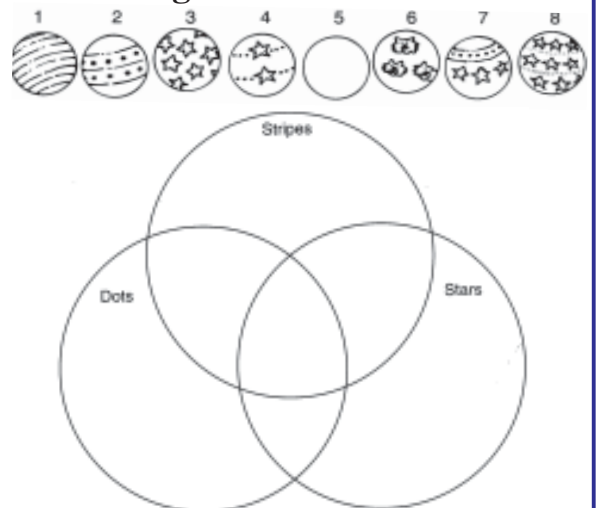
11. Which of the boxes on the right will the shape on the left make if it is folded up?



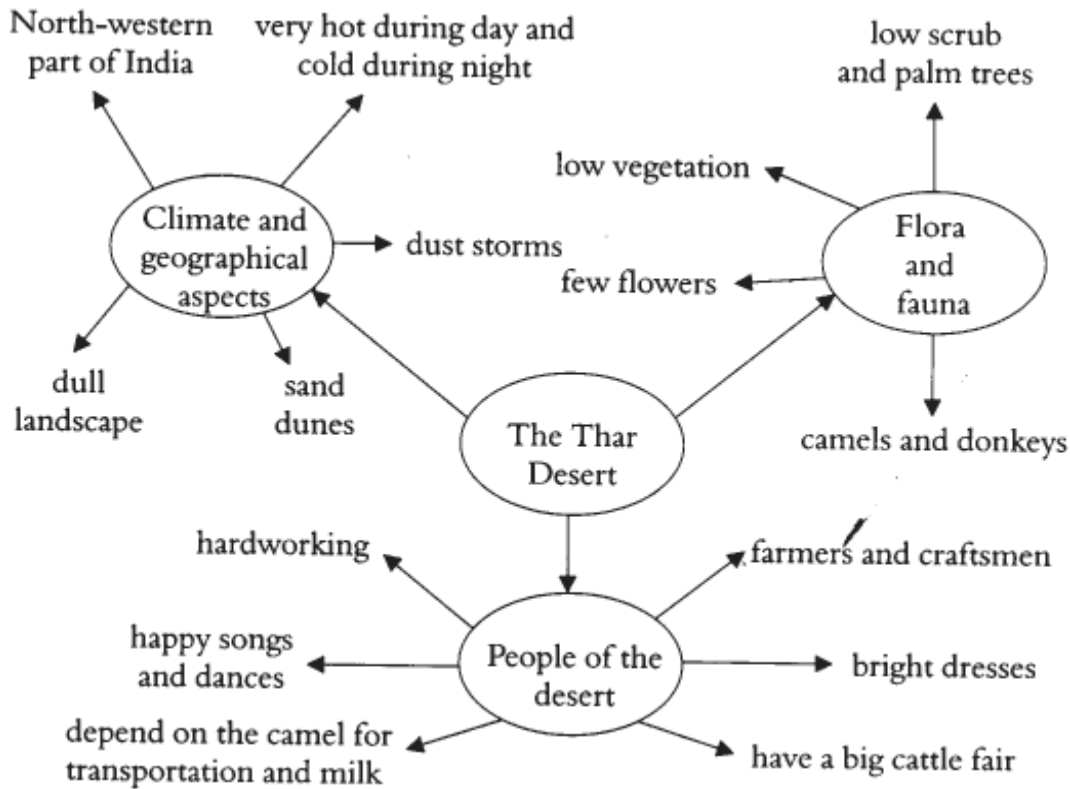
10. Complete this pie graph to show how you spend your day at school. Show all your subjects, lunch and recess breaks, and the amount of time each one takes.
